.... \$400,000 for Wolmer's Girls Track and Field Development Programme

Loud cheers greeted **Shelly-Ann Fraser** as she alighted from the vehicle on the grounds of her Alma Mater, Wolmer's Girl school, to deliver the good news that GraceKennedy would be giving a boost to the Track and Field Development programme at the school, in honour of Shelly-Ann's achievements.

The cheers grew louder as Douglas Orane, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of GraceKennedy, announced the contribution made to Wolmer's Girls School on behalf of Shelly-Ann Fraser, whom they have been sponsoring since late 2008.
